

Travel to Port Townsend, WA

By Car

From Seattle: Take I-5 North to EXIT 177. Merge onto WA-104W towards Edmonds/Kingston Ferry. Follow signs to Kingston/Edmonds Ferry. Check Ferry schedule (information below). After Ferry continue on WA-104W. Follow signs to Hood Canal Bridge. After bridge Turn RIGHT onto WA-19/Beaver Valley Rd. WA-19 becomes WA-20. Follow WA-20 into Port Townsend. If you bring a vehicle, arriving at the ferry terminal 45 minutes ahead of scheduled sailings should be adequate. Longer waits are possible at peak travel times on summer and holiday weekends.

From SEA/TAC Airport

Grayline Airport Express (206-624-5077) “N” and “S” ends of baggage claim area; Shuttle Express (206-622-1424, or 1-800-487-7433) call for pick up from Traveler’s Info Center at SEA/TAC baggage claim area; Metro Transit (206-553-3000) bus marked “To Downtown Seattle”, “S” end of baggage claim area - All have bus service to Seattle Ferry Terminal (206-464-6400, or 1-800-843-3779 in Washington); catch ferry to Bainbridge Island; transfer to Kitsap Transit (360-697-2877 or www.kitsaptransit.org) bus to Poulsbo; transfer to Jefferson Transit (360-385-4777 or www.jerffersontransit.com) bus to Port Townsend.

From Vancouver Island and Points West

Coho Ferry (1-360-457-4491) - To Port Angeles, Washington.

Clallam Transit (206-452-4511, or 1-800-858-3747 in western Washington) bus to Sequim; transfer to Jefferson Transit (360-385-4777 or www.jerffersontransit.com) bus to Port Townsend.

Driving - Highway 101 to State Route 20.

From Points North

Driving - SR 20 to Keystone on Whidbey Island; catch the WA State Ferry (1-888-808-7977) to Port Townsend.

The easiest way to get to Port Townsend is by car. If you plan to cross Puget Sound by ferry, be aware that many runs are crowded during the summer so you should allow time for wait lines. Many choose to “drive around” by crossing the Tacoma Narrows Bridge and driving up the Kitsap Peninsula.
